
ARE UNIVERSITY GRADUATES SATISFIED WITH THEIR EDUCATION?

The vast majority of graduates were satisfied


with aspects of teaching and overall educational quality in their first degree program



Graduates asked to think back on their university experience were more likely to say that their investment of time was well worth it compared to their financial investment:




Financial investment
