
## Do university- and college-bound students have different postsecondary education expectations?


Survey of Maritime grade 12 students reveals similarities and differences in the education expectations of the university- and college-bound:

University- and college-bound students **Share**<sup>1</sup> similar expectations for many aspects of a quality education

<sup>1</sup> Share: less than 10 percentage points difference



#### Percent who "definitely expect" from a quality education:



The university- bound have higher expectations<sup>2</sup> for their education to provide personal and skills development


<sup>2</sup> Higher expectations: difference is 10 percentage points or greater



The **college-bound** are <u>more likely</u> than the university-bound to say they definitely expect a quality education to prepare them for the workforce (71% vs. 53% of university-bound)

#### College-bound women

are the least likely to say they definitely expect to develop math skills (16%)



#### College-bound men

have the lowest expectations (compared to universitybound men and all women):

- To grow as a person (38%)
- To be prepared for further studies (33%)
- For cultural interactions (33%)
- To develop writing skills (12%)

#### What you should know about the Study

The survey was conducted by MQO Research on behalf of the Commission, and in collaboration with the departments of Education in the three Maritime provinces, between May 9—June 11, 2014 in 175 Maritime high schools. Surveys were administered online by participating schools, and were available in English and French. The total sample of 5,219 represents 25% of the total grade 12 population of 20,805. The margin of error for the survey is  $\pm 1.4\%$ , 19 times out of 20. All statistics presented have been generated from weighted data; data were weighted on the basis of school board within each province to adjust to proportional representation in the population.
