The 2014 survey of Grade 12 students The Commission designed the survey in collaboration with the departments of Education in the three Maritime provinces. Data collection was conducted by MQO Research between May 9 – June 11, 2014 in 175 Maritime high schools. Surveys were administered online by participating schools, and were available in English and French. The analysis is limited to university-bound students, who comprise 46% of all respondents, or 2,413 individuals. The margin of error is ± 2.0 %, 19 times out of 20. All statistics presented have been generated from weighted data; data were weighted on the basis of school board within each province to adjust to proportional representation in the population. The 2014 survey of Class of 2012 Maritime university graduates The survey of the Class of 2012 was conducted by Advanis Inc. on behalf of the Maritime Provinces Higher Education Commission in Fall 2014. This analysis is limited to those who had completed their first degree in 2012. To ensure comparability with the statistics from the survey of Maritime grade 12 students, the analysis is further restricted to those graduates who had been living in NB, NS, or PEI prior to enrolment in that first degree (n=1,578). The

margin of error for this group is $\pm 2.1\%$, 19 times out of 20. All statistics presented have been generated from weighted data;

CUSC 2012 survey of graduating students The Commission analyzed the data from the 2012 survey of graduating students conducted by Canadian University Survey Consortium (CUSC). The analysis was conducted under data sharing agreements with the five Maritime universities that participated in the survey. To ensure comparability with the statistics from the survey of Maritime grade 12 students, the analysis was restricted to those graduating students who had been living in NB, NS, or PEI prior to enrolment (n=1288). The margin of error for this group is $\pm 2.8\%$, 19 times out of 20. All statistics presented have been generated from weighted data; data were weighted on the basis of the university of graduation.
