UNIVERSITY ENROLMENT 2020 - 2021

In 2020-2021, **70,575** students were enrolled in Maritime universities, up 0.9% over one year and 1.5% over 10 years. 84.1% of students were enrolled at the undergraduate level, while 15.9% were enrolled at the graduate level. Both undergraduate (+0.4%) and graduate (+3.3%) enrolments increased over one year. In Fall 2020, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, many Maritime universities had switched to online delivery of programs which appears to have had an impact on certain enrolment trends. Full-time enrolment decreased by 1% across the Maritimes, but this decrease was offset by the 11.2% jump in part-time enrolment. Full-time and part-time enrolment both decreased in *Architecture*, engineering and related technologies programs, leading to an overall enrolment drop of -7.3%. Conversely, enrolment in *Mathematics, computer and information sciences* programs increased by 10.3%, followed by *Education* (+8.1%) and *Social and behavioural sciences and law* (+6.1%). The number of international students decreased by 4.1% in 2020-2021 after showing enrolment increases in every year since 2010-2011 (up 102.7% over 10 years). This one-year drop has been offset by increased enrolment of students from the Maritime provinces (up 1.9%) and Canadian students from outside the Maritimes (up 3.6%).

New Brunswick experienced a one-year enrolment decrease of 1.1% to **18,662** students (-16.1% over 10 years). Enrolment declines over one year were observed among students of all origins: NB residents (-0.5%), students from other Maritime provinces (-5.3%), Canadian students from outside the Maritimes (-0.5%), and international students (-1.8%).

Nova Scotia experienced a one-year enrolment increase of 1.2% to **46,888** students (+9.4% over 10 years). Enrolment over one year increased for NS residents (+3.6%), students from other Maritime provinces (+1.7%), and Canadian students from outside the Maritimes (+4.1%), but decreased for international students (-5.7%) compared to the previous year.

Prince Edward Island experienced a one-year enrolment increase of 5.7% to **5,025** students (+13.8% over 10 years). Enrolment over one year increased for home province residents (+5.1%), students from other Maritime provinces (+1.5%), and Canadian students from outside the Maritimes (+13.8%). The number of international students was also up 6.1%. This continues the province's increased international enrolment over 10 years (+210.2%).

University participation of Maritimers in the Maritimes has been steadily decreasing over the past decade, reaching 21.6% in 2020-2021 (-0.2 percentage point over one year and -1.8 pp over 10 years). The home province participation rate increased by 0.3 pp in NS over one year, while it decreased by 0.4 pp in NB and 0.2 pp in PEI (-0.8 pp, -1.8 pp and -5.3 pp in NS, NB and PEI over 10 years, respectively).







Table 7: Total Enrolment by Province, Major Field of Study, and Level of Study
