UNIVERSITY ENROLMENT 2021-2022

In 2021-2022, **71,911** students were enrolled in Maritime universities, an increase of 1.9% over the previous year and 8.7% over five years. The increase was present both at the undergraduate (+0.7%) and graduate (+8.4%) levels. In 2020-2021, a widespread temporary shift towards part-time enrolment was observed as many universities switched to online delivery or delayed admissions in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The shift reversed in 2021-2022 as full-time enrolment increased by 3.7% across the region, and part-time enrolment decreased by 6.6%. Enrolment increased in all fields of study, except *Humanities* (-0.6%) and *Architecture*, *engineering*, *and related technologies* (-8.1%).

New Brunswick saw an enrolment increase of 2.2% to 19,020 students (+0.9% over five years). Enrolment of NB residents and students from the other Maritime provinces decreased (-1.5% and -5.0% over one year, respectively). These decreases were more than offset by the growth in enrolment of Canadian students from outside the Maritimes (+1.7%) and international students (+25.3%).

Nova Scotia experienced an enrolment increase of 1.6% to 47,659 students (+10.6% over five years). Enrolment increased for NS residents (+2.6%), students from the other Maritime provinces (+3.9%), and Canadian students from outside the Maritimes (+6.6%), but decreased for international students (-5.5%).

Prince Edward Island continued to experience strong enrolment growth, increasing 4.1% to 5,232 students (+24.7% over five years). Enrolment increases were observed across all student categories: home province residents (+0.8%), students from other Maritime provinces (+7.9%), Canadian students from outside the Maritimes (+1.3%), and international students (+9.8%).

In 2021-2022, Maritime universities saw a continued influx of Canadian students from outside the region: compared to the previous year, enrolment of students from Ontario increased by 5.4%, and enrolment of other Canadiens by 5.8%. International enrolment has not fully rebounded from the drop observed in 2020-2021, and remained largely flat (+0.9%), likely due to continued travel disruptions related to COVID-19. Regionally, enrolment of NB and PEI residents slightly decreased (-0.2% and -0.1%, respectively). Enrolment of NS residents increased (+2.3%), partially driven by a one-time bump in the number of high school graduates in 2021. In 2008, Nova Scotia changed its Grade Primary cut-off age, resulting in about 2,100 additional students becoming eligible to start school a year earlier.







Table 7: Total Enrolment by Province, Major Field of Study, and Level of Study
