# TRENDS IN MARITIME HIGHER EDUCATION

### **UNIVERSITY ENROLMENT 2022-2023**

In 2022-2023, **72,969** students were enrolled in Maritime universities, up 1.5% over one year and 3.8% over ten years. At the undergraduate level, full-time enrolment increased by 3.9% and part-time enrolment decreased by 10.3% over one year, resulting in an overall increase of 2.2%. At the graduate level, full-time enrolment decreased by 1.6% and part-time enrolment decreased by 3.5%, with an overall decrease in enrolment of 2.2%.

Enrolment in *Mathematics, computer and information sciences* programs increased by 12.3% over one year and by 165.9% over ten years. Enrolment in *Health and related fields* increased by 6.2% and 11.7% over one and ten years, respectively.

**New Brunswick** experienced an enrolment increase of 1.3% to 19,267 students, although over ten years total enrolment decreased by 11.9%. Enrolment of NB residents and students from the other Maritime provinces decreased (-3.3% and -6.4% over one year, respectively). Enrolment increased among Canadian students from outside the Maritimes (+2.2%) and international students (+22.4%).

**Nova Scotia** experienced an enrolment increase of 1.4% to 48,338 students (+9.8% over ten years). Enrolment decreased among NS residents (-2.4%), students from the other Maritime provinces (-1.6%), and Canadian students from outside the Maritimes (-2.0%), but increased for international students (+13.8%).

**Prince Edward Island** saw continued growth in enrolment, increasing 2.5% to 5,364 students (+22.3% over ten years). Enrolment was largely stable among home province residents (+0.1%) and Canadian students from outside the Maritimes (+0.2%). Enrolment of international students increased (+8.9%), but there were fewer students from other Maritime provinces (-1.4%).

In 2022-2023, there were fewer Canadian students enrolled in the region: enrolment of NB residents decreased over one year by 2.9%, NS residents decreased by 2.6%, PEI residents decreased by 1.0%, and other Canadians decreased by 1.3%. International students were the sole source of enrolment growth in the region as their number increased by 15.1% over the previous year. University participation of Maritimers in Maritime universities decreased by 1.8 percentage points to 20.3%.





